IMPACT (Improve and Maximize Programs so All Children Thrive)

We're excited to announce the release of applications on August 1, 2016 for the IMPACT program! IMPACT has been called "Race, Jr." because it continues the work of Race to the Top, known locally as **Raising Quality!**. While we were able to work with over 200 programs in Race, availability of slots in IMPACT is limited to 87 sites. Sites will be enrolled according to selection criteria that places an emphasis on those serving children with high/special needs, both center- and home-based settings, as well as alternative sites.

Workshops will be held to familiarize applicants with the IMPACT program. First 5 staff will be on hand to assist with completing the applications and to answer any questions you might have. A Look Back at Race to the Top . . .

As we transition to IMPACT, we look back on our Race to the Top journey . . .

Race to the Top was formally launched in 2013, and the local consortium adopted the **Raising Quality!** name to reflect the program's goals and aspirations. In the three years of operation, you have undergone assessments, furthered your education with college coursework, and received trainings on metrics of early childhood care and learning.

It has been a long journey fraught with ups and downs, laughter and tears, but you persisted, and the results are powerful:

- **Racing to the Top:** Programs advanced through the tiers, with a majority landing at Tier 4!
- **Coaching:** Nearly 60 providers received onsite coaching through **Raising Quality!** Advisors, receiving support in topics such as curriculum, health and nutrition, special needs, DRDP, and the ERS tools.
- **Training:** The consortium offered well-attended free/low cost trainings on a broad spectrum that supported the elements of the rating matrix (e.g., FCCERS, ASQ, DRDP) as well as general topics relevant to early learning and development (e.g., Cultural Proficiency, Protective Factors).
- **Scholarships:** Nearly 100 awards (almost \$45,000) were made for coursework and professional development!
- **Professional development:** Many of you are pursuing credentials, permits and degrees now!
- **Parent awareness:** Providers report that parents have become increasingly involved with their quality improvement efforts and have become more aware of the providers' critical role in supporting their children's school readiness.
- **Quality Awards:** Over \$1M in Quality Awards was disbursed, representing an incredible re-investment into local programs!

The local consortium of stakeholders has been impressed by the changes taking place in our community. **Your hard work has benefited over 4,000 children and families throughout our county.** We are proud to be witness to not only the changes in your own programs, but to the promise of systemic changes in early care and education that are the overarching goals of the Quality movement.

It has been inspiring to be part of your journeys as you took risks, implemented new practices, grew (both personally and professionally), and displayed your commitment to improving the quality of your programs. We salute you for the tremendous work you do to help the children of our community, and hope to be a partner in your continuing journey of improvement. In our next issue of this newsletter, look for success stories from our IMPACT sites!
